

Animal Physiologist Faculty Position Opening

The Department of Biology at the University of Wisconsin Oshkosh invites applications for an assistant professor position beginning September 2024, contributing primarily to the Oshkosh campus, with the possibility of contributing to both campuses. This tenuretrack faculty position will involve teaching courses in Introductory Biology, Human Physiology, Animal Physiology and an upper-level physiology elective in the candidates area of expertise. Our teaching expectations include the ability to teach in multiple modalities such as online (synchronous or asynchronous) and hybrid courses, due to the changing needs of our students. The successful candidate will pursue an active research program, involving undergraduate and MS students, perform campus and community service, service to the profession, as well as be given the opportunity to participate in department and campus governance. Submit a letter of application, brief statements of teaching philosophy and research or professional development plans, CV, electronic copies of a maximum of 3 publications, a list of 3 professional references, as well as official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions attended. UW System requires a criminal background check for successful candidates.
